

In the school year 2021/22, attention was paid to better understand the relationship between people, to respect oneself and others, to cultural diversity, environmental protection, natural and cultural heritage. Participating students researched and created under the guidance of mentors on the chosen topic "Values in the Light of Lifelong Learning".

Under the guidance of their mentors, the students created many literary and artistic contribution; Ukrainian schools also presented their thoughts with research papers.
